#### CITY GARBAGE SERVICE

As of 4/1/03, VAN DYKE SANITATION, (Norman Van Dyke) 340 Howard Street W, Edgerton, MN 56128, 1-507-442-7241, picks up our solid waste (garbage) every **THURSDAY** morning.

We have a volume-based garbage system in Jasper. Everyone pays the pass-by fee of \$4.80 plus solid waste management tax of 9.75%. Then your garbage bill adds the size of cart you have with three sizes available—so your total garbage bill will be \$8.27 for the small (35-40 gal.), \$12.00 for the medium (60-65 gal.), or \$14.20 for the large (90-95 gal.) This will be billed to you on the city's monthly bill. You do not need to buy any special kind of bags, just place your garbage/trash in the cart. If you leave your residence, you must leave the cart at the address. If you have too much garbage for your cart from time to time, you MUST BUY sticker labels at the City of Jasper office, 10 for \$10, and place one on each extra bag of extra trash.

**RECYCLING:** VanDyke Sanitation also does our curbside recycling sponsored by Pipestone County with pickup every other Thursday. Items need to be sorted properly or they will not be picked up in your bin. Check with the City Office for the current schedule and the items that can now be recycled. A county recycling shed is also located at 203 1<sup>st</sup> Street E.

### CITY'S SURCHARGES (\$2.50 + \$7.00 + \$.50 = \$10.00)

- ✓ The City of Jasper charges a \$2.50 per month (as of 1/1/10) surcharge that helps defray expenses incurred for billing, leasing a compost and burnable materials site, and the Spring Junk/Trash pickup day in May. Due to a change in policies, yard wastes will be picked up by the city ONLY if resident purchases yard waste tags at the Jasper Mini-Mall, 10 for \$10. A tag must be affixed each time to each yard waste bag and/or container of branches that is placed on the curb on Mondays, 8 AM, from April to October. If you would prefer to take large amounts of yard waste to our compost site, keys are available at the City Office.
- ✓ As of 7/1/08, the council added \$.50 service charge per month in order to make a deficit in the garbage fund. The \$2.50 + \$.50 charge will be listed separately on the bill as service charge.
- ✓ Beginning 1/1/11, the council instituted a \$10.00 monthly charge to cover costs incurred for seal coating our streets. This \$10.00 charge will be listed separately on bill as Seal Coating.
- The City of Jasper sponsors a Spring Junk/Trash pickup day in order to help our residents keep the city clean. We encourage everyone to participate. Details will be in the Jasper Journal and in the city's quarterly newsletter. Watch for the dates; it's usually in May.

  Please note: no demolition or building materials will be picked up during this citywide cleanup. You need to rent either a dumpster or roll-off trailer for this disposal. One can be rented from Van Dyke Sanitation (507-442-7241), L & L Sanitation (Slayton 1-800-380-2561), or D's Sanitation (Pipestone 825-3670).

### \$4.00 Minimum Charge

- ➤ Water Debt Service: Beginning 4/1/95, every household, church, and business has \$8.50/mo. debt service charge added to their bills to help defray the costs of upgrading the city's water distribution system and hooking up to Lincoln-Pipestone Rural Water.
- Sewer Rate (as of 4/95)\$2.25/1000 Gal.

\$2.25 Minimum Charge

- > Sewer Debt Service: Beginning 8/1/95, everyone with a sewer hookup has \$16.00/mo. debt service in order to pay for our new wastewater ponds.
- > MN Dept. of Health Water Meter Connection Fee is a mandatory testing charge for \$6.36; the city has changed their method of collection to \$.53 per month.

**IMPORTANT!** It is *illegal* to dump water from your sump pump into the sewer system. This water needs to be placed either on your lawn (but not damaging a neighbor's property) or into the street.

If you have any questions about the water or sewer debt service, please contact the city office. A permanent shut-off for water and/or sewer can be obtained with the city council's approval. However, if service is resumed in the future, there is a \$500 charge for water and a \$500 charge for sewer reconnection fee.

Every house, church, or business is assessed the monthly minimum water charge, sewer charge, debt services for both water and sewer, monthly surcharge and household garbage charges whether the building is occupied or not. Rental properties are charged back to the owners of the property. Landlords are contacted if utility bills are not paid up-to-date. Utility charges that are not paid are ultimately put on the property taxes.



**DEPOSIT CHARGE:** All new water and sewer customers are required to pay a **deposit of \$100** before service begins in order to insure payment of the bill. The deposit will be refunded within one year if the customer has established a history of paying his/her account in full and on time.

BILLINGS for Sewer, Water, and Garbage are sent out on the last business day of the month; PAYMENT IS DUE on or before the 20<sup>TH</sup> of the following month. Any customer who believes they will be unable to pay their entire bill by the 20<sup>th</sup> must make arrangements to come to the regular council meeting that current month. Any utility bill NOT received at the City Office before 3:00 PM on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of the month will be considered delinquent. Should the 20<sup>th</sup> day of the month fall on a weekend or holiday, the time will be extended to 3:00 PM on the next business day. If not paid by the 20<sup>th</sup>, a late charge of \$10 is added to your account. A notice will be mailed to you; due notice will be posted on the resident's door. If any bill is not paid in full on or before the 25<sup>th</sup> of the month, water will be disconnected. If water is shut off, a \$30 SHUT OFF/TURN ON charge is added to your bill. Before water is reconnected, all charges need to be paid by cash, money order, or cashier check during regular business hours.



Most of the schools offer bus transportation in Jasper.

- ✓ Please do not forget some of the resources that we have available through Family Service Agencies—either Pipestone County, 825-3357, or Rock County, 507/283-9507-- depending on where you live. Let us emphasize, if you are having financial problems with the utility bills, do not hesitate to contact them. You must give them an opportunity to help you. They have a number of programs that may assist you, but you have to ask!
- ✓ An Assisted Living Facility is available at the Jasper Sunrise Village, 100 Robert Avenue N, 348-8620. The Jasper Economic Development Authority owns this facility. There are 25 rooms with three meals a day plus snacks, home and health care provided, medication reminders, nursing care, and staffed 24 hours a day. Contact Laurie Ykema, Director.
- ✓ There are eight market-rate townhomes for rent at the Rose Villas and the Split Rock Villas that were built, owned, and managed by the Jasper Economic Development Authority. For information, please contact Laurie Ykema at Sunrise Village.






# Curbside pick-up is offered to all residents of the cities of Pipestone, Edgerton, Jasper & Ruthton The sheds in these cities are intended only for use by the rural residents of Pipestone County. City residents should be utilizing the curbside recycling that is offered.

- The recycling sheds are emptied every day in the cities of Pipestone and Edgerton.
- In Jasper the recycling sheds are emptied three times a week.
- The recycling sheds are emptied twice a week in the cities of Hatfield, Holland, Ihlen, Ruthton, Trosky and Woodstock.

### Recycle. Recycle. Recycle.

And do it over and over again.

Here is a reminder of what is and is not accepted for curbside recycling.

HOW TO USE YOUR BIN: Put three paper grocery bags in your yellow recycling bin for separated <u>PLASTICS</u>, <u>GLASS</u>, <u>AND METALS</u>. If you have an abundance of any one item, you may have 2 or 3 bags of the same material, <u>just don't mix them</u>.



NEWSPAPER: PLACE ON TOP OF OR BESIDE BIN. Place in brown paper bags or tied in bundles with string (no plastic ties).

NOT ACCEPTABLE: Magazines, junk mail, paper milk cartons, paperboard such as pop or beer cartons, cereal or pizza boxes, etc. will not be accepted with any recyclables. These items must be put into L & L Sanitation garbage bags.

CORRUGATED CARDBOARD: This is acceptable but must be cut down. Cut down paper boxes, flatten and tie in 3' by 3' bundles or place in cardboard box. DO NOT PUT IN PAPER BAG.

METAL: Rinse, remove paper labels, empty, & <u>CLEAN</u>, remove ends and flatten whenever possible. Tin cans, aluminum cans, clean aluminum foil, and pie plates are also accepted. NO AEROSOL OR PAINT CANS.

PLASTICS: WASH, REMOVE CAPS AND LIDS-FLATTEN. Narrow-necked bottles only; milk jugs, pop bottles, and other bottles numbered 1 or 2 on the bottom. NO MARGARINE, COTTAGE CHEESE CONTAINERS, ICE CREAM PAILS, 6-PACK RINGS, PLASTIC BAGS, TOYS, HOSE, OR PIPE ACCEPTED!! Motor oil containers, with the lid securely replaced, must be put in regular garbage, NOT in with the recyclable plastics.

GLASS: Clear, brown, or green. WASH, remove lids and metal ting. Put in paper grocery bags. No need to remove labels. NO BROKEN GLASS. NO CERAMICS such as plates, cups, or ovenware. NO MILKY WHITE BOTTLES that resemble ceramics. NO plate glass, window glass, mirrors, or drinking glasses. NO HEAT RESISTANT GLASS, such as Pyrex. NO LEAD BASED GLASS such as crystal or TV tubes. NO LIGHT BULBS or fluorescent bulbs.
