PET LICENSES ARE PAST DUE: Animal licenses expire March 31st yearly. **\$5 late charge.** Stop in to the city office and register your animal. Proof of vaccination by a licensed veterinarian is required in order to obtain a license. 3 ANIMALS MAX PER HOUSEHOLD!

PLEASE keep your pets fed, watered, and QUIET. Pets should not be allowed to bother other residents. For owners who take care of their pets, THANK YOU FOR BEING A GOOD NEIGHBOR.

Please clean up after your pets. Complaints should be reported to Pipestone County Law Enforcement at 825-1100. You do not necessarily have to identify yourself when calling. All animals (includes CATS) need to be on a leash! Anyone that needs a copy of ORDINANCE No. 91, it is available at the city office.



2018 Consumer Confidence Report Attached on Pages 5 & 6

All community water systems must distribute a drinking water report known as a Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) annually to their customers.

We will be spraying for mosquitos every 2 to 3 weeks throughout the summer & fall depending on the weather. Spraying will be done at dusk Thursday evenings. The spray is the same spray used in Sioux Falls & other towns. It is E.P.A. approved. It is safe for humans, pets & fish.



ATTENTION ATV OR GOLF CART OWNERS:

If you wish to drive your vehicles in Jasper (LICENSED DRIVERS ARE THE ONLY ONE'S ELIGIBLE), you must purchase a permit. Permits for 2019 are now available for \$10 at the city office, good until 12-31-19. You need to show proof of a driver's license, vehicle ID information & DNR ID number in order to get this permit. This information is forwarded to the Sheriff's Department. NO DIRT BIKES or GO CARTS CAN BE RIDDEN IN TOWN; those vehicles must be placed on a trailer & ridden only on private property out of town-not city property!

Truck Parking: RESIDENTIAL AREAS ARE NOT DESIGNATED FOR TRUCK PARKING!

ACCORDING TO THE JASPER CITY CODE: "IT IS UNLAWFUL TO PARK A TRUCK OR COMMERCIAL VEHICLE OF MORE THAN ONE TON CAPACITY IN A RESIDENTIAL AREA." SECTION 8.17, SUBD. 2

Please utilize the truck parking area at the ballfields.

CONGRATULATIONS TO BRIAN THODE: Wastewater Superintendent/Operator! Receiving "Certificate of Commendation" for outstanding operation, maintenance and management of our wastewater treatment system. This award recognizes ensuring: overseen by property certified operator, did not exceed the effluent limits contained in our permit, all required monthly & annual reports were timely & complete, facility did not experience any bypasses, enforcement actions or inspections identifying significant compliance concerns.



It is everyone's responsibility to cooperate in keeping their property's grass mowed, the weeds sprayed, and the litter removed. Please assist in making everyone proud of <u>YOUR community!</u> Grass should be no more than 6 inches in height. If the property is not maintained, the city will come and do the work. We will send you a bill or it will be put on your property taxes. A minimum \$75 charge.

We encourage all property owners to trim your trees both on the sidewalk where people walk and any tree or bushes that are in the alleys. Residents MUST mow their half of the alley. Trees also need to be trimmed along the streets-limbs need to be 12' off the ground and nothing beyond the curb due to public works equipment (sweeper and snow plow) being used on the streets. If you don't trim them, the employees will trim trees when they have the time. Low-hanging branches on the sidewalks make it difficult for residents to use what sidewalks we have in town. It not only looks better, but you will find it easier to mow your lawn. In the alleys, remember you want that alley wide enough so that if a fire truck, ambulance, pickup with a mosquito sprayer on it, or city vehicles cleaning alleys need to go through that alley-they want to go through without scratching the vehicles. **GET RID OF GROUND VINES TO HELP YOUR TREES!**





Yard Waste Site: If you have yard waste (grass clippings, tree branches, leaves) you can pick up a key at the City Office & bring them out to the site. Return key IMMEDIATELY or within 24 HOURS; within 48 HOURS if checked out over the weekend. PLEASE remember NO GARBAGE!!! If the Department of Forestry Inspector finds something wrong he could shut down the site & everyone will loose their privileges. (They come without warning.) Yard waste pickup will continue on Mondays. Have totes to street by 7:00 a.m. Tag required/weight limits apply.

The only burning that is allowed in the City of Jasper is in contained patio fireplaces where wood ONLY is well contained. NO GARBAGE BURNING, NO CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS, NOTHING THAT WOULD BE CONSIDERED HAZARDOUS! No ash particles floating around either your house or to the neighbors...NO EXCEPTIONS! If the Fire Department is called out to contain a fire, the resident will be charged for a fire call...\$400.00 for the first hour!





Starting a Project? Land use permits are needed for construction that alters the boundaries of the present building even if a contractor is doing the work, moving in a building (garage, utility sheds) and installation of fences. Check with the city office if you have any questions.

STORM SIREN: Sirens will continue to be tested on the first Wednesday of each month. Pipestone County Law Enforcement sounds the siren. DO NOT CALL, Take Shelter! IF SIRENS SOUND AT OTHER TIMES GO INSIDE & TUNE TO LOCAL MEDIA!
